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Local Cisco academy performs well at international networking competition

Matthew Kean and Cory McLeod of the Mount Pearl Senior High Cisco networking academy, were one of three teams competing from across Canada which qualified for the NetRiders Theatre Finale, April 30th.

The Mount Pearl academy, lead by instructor Craig Janes, is a local of the Division of Lifelong Learning's regional academy.

The NetRiders Theatre Finale involves networking academy students from across the United States and Canada competing in a variety of activities, including a timed theoretical exam, a packet tracer network simulation activity and a packet tracer exam.

The Mount Pearl team placed 24th out of 30 teams in the finale.

"That's a highly respectable placing," says Rob Ryan, manager of the Division of Lifelong Learning's Cisco Regional Networking Academy. "They were 24th out of 30 teams, but they got there (the third round) by going head-to-head with more than 400 of the top networking students in North America."

Ryan also had high praise for Craig Janes, the teams instructor. According to Ryan, Craig spent most of his 2009 summer training in Cisco so that Mt. Pearl High could offer the program.

The Cisco Networking Academy is a global technology education program that provides students with networking and technical skills to prepare them for careers in the 21st century. Committed to delivering the highest standard of information technology education to students of all nationalities, genders and economic brackets, the program is designed to offer students real-world skills that will position them for employment and career growth.

Waterloo Math Contests

Each year students of MPSH compete with schools all across Canada in the University of Waterloo mathematics contests. MPSH is pleased to announce the following results for the 2009-2010 school year.

In the Grade 10 Cayley contest, there were 44 schools across Newfoundland and Labrador who participated in this contest with a total of 641 students. MPSH placed 4th in the province. Katelyn Mavin was the top-scorer at MPSH and placed within the top 25% of all contestants in Canada and ranked 10th in Newfoundland and Labrador. She received a medal and a Certificate of Distinction from the University of Waterloo. A school's score on the contest ranked

consists of the sum of the scores of the school's top three contestants. The second place scorer at MPSH was Timothy Elliott and the third place scorer was Tyler Hoyles. These students also placed in the top 25% of all contestants in Canada and received Certificates of Distinction. Courtney Aker also placed in the top 25% of all contestants in Canada and received a Certificate of Distinction.

In the Grade 11 Fermat contest, there were 43 schools across Newfoundland and Labrador who participated in this contest with a total of 590 students. MPSH placed 1st in the province. Daniel Juteau was the top-scorer at MPSH and placed within the top 4% of all contestants in Canada and

3rd in Newfoundland and Labrador. He received a medal and a Certificate of Distinction from the University of Waterloo. As previously stated, a school's score on the contest consists of the sum of the scores of the school's top three contestants. The second place scorer at MPSH was Kylie Everard and there was a tie for the third place scorer with Jeff Morris and Amy Taylor. These students placed in the top 25% of all contestants in Canada and received Certificates of Distinction. Daniel, Kylie, Jeff, and Amy were presented with the Provincial Champions Plaque and the Zone Champions Plaque at a recent assembly. Alexa Bull, Krista Burton, and Kara Langdon also placed in the top 25% of all contestants in Canada and

received Certificates of Distinction.

In the Grade 12 Euclid contest, there were 16 schools across Newfoundland and Labrador who participated in this contest. MPSH placed 5th in the province. Gillian Elliott was the top-scorer in this school placed within the top 25% of all contestants in Canada and ranked 6th in the province. She received a medal and a Cer-

Eamon was also notified this week by mail that he will be a recipient of the Premier's Athletic Award of Excellence in his sport at a presentation ceremony some time in April.

Mathematical Jeopardy

MPSH is pleased to announce that Department Head, Mrs. Joanne Sparkes, applied for and obtained funding from the Department of Education, under the Provincial Mathematics Strategy Promotional Campaign, for a project called **Mathematical Jeopardy – How SMART are you?** For this project, math teachers created SMART Board Math Jeopardy games for each math course -- the categories were the units in each course. Questions ranged in difficulty level, a \$100 question was much easier and required less work than a \$500 question.

Mathematical Jeopardy was played in most math classes on June 7 and

June 8. Students arranged themselves in teams of four to play the game. Questions were selected from the SMART Board by teams on a rotation basis. Each team had the same amount of time to answer the selected question (for several questions, students needed to do calculations on scrap paper). Each team wrote their answer on a mini dry erase board. After the teacher indicated time was up, a representative from each team flipped over their mini dry erase board to display their team's answer. Teams having the correct response, received points equivalent to the dollar amount for that question, teams having an incorrect

response, lost points equivalent to the dollar amount for that question, and the total points that a team had previously accumulated remained the same if they had no response. The teacher explained how to do the question and displayed the current "money" balance of each team. The next question was selected and the game continued until the end of the period. The students on the winning team were given "1, 2, 3, 4, 5, ... Math is the Only Subject That Counts" t-shirts. The project was a great success. Math was presented in a fun manner and students thoroughly enjoyed Mathematical Jeopardy!

Jason Harnum Brings Home the GOLD!!

Jason Harnum attended the 2010 28th annual Canadian Airgun Grand Prix held in Toronto, Ontario on Feb. 19-21. This is one of the biggest tournaments in North America. Jason has been a member of the 2011 Canada Games Marksmanship Training Group for just 4 years. He arrived in Toronto on Thursday the 18th. He competed as an international sharp shooter during the entire event. A relay consists of 60 shots fired at 10 meters, in the standing position, in a time limit of 1 hour & 45 minutes. The Canadian Airgun Grand Prix requires you do this twice over the course of the weekend. Jason shot his first relay on Friday 6:30 at night. When he finished he felt it went ex-

tremely well. It wasn't until Saturday morning he had a chance to see his score. Jason shot a new personal best of 543 out of 600. Jason shot his second relay Saturday at 10:15am shooting 536 out of 600. He knew he was in a good position for a medal but needed to endure an agonizing wait over the weekend for the other scores to be tallied. Jason brought home the GOLD with an incredible lead of 25 points. Jason is also a part of the Marksmanship team with the 284 Marconi Sea Cadets with whom he went to nationals and achieved the title of top sea cadet shooter in Canada
